Additional Information

NWEA MAP Growth is a consistent "point of pride" for Saginaw Preparatory Academy. It's important to note that there are substantial differences between this school year and a "typical" school year, and those differences have negatively impacted student growth as measured by the NWEA MAP Growth assessment.

- Approximately 40% of Saginaw Prep's K-8 students attended in a hybrid format during Quarter 1, meaning they physically attended school two days per week and learned asynchronously the remaining three days. The remaining 60% learned in a fully-virtual format per parent/guardian selection. All students attended in a fully-virtual format during Quarter 2.
- Our previous growth is based on meeting the academic, social-emotional, and physical needs of our students five days per week via an in-person learning framework. Academic growth has been negatively impacted by the physical setup constraints necessary due to COVID-19 and corresponding CDC and MDHHS guidance.
- All students completed their NWEA Winter MAP Benchmark virtually and did not have the benefit of the
 controlled and learning-focused environment they had for Fall 2020 testing. Additionally, Winter testing
 began a month earlier than usual to allow for sufficient time to complete testing in this fully virtual format.
 This reduced learning time available to the students before the completed their Winter benchmark.
